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# Performance Review & Market Commentary

The Aeon Enhanced Equity Prescient Fund outperformed its benchmark by 38 bps for the second quarter of 2017 on a gross return basis and is in line with its benchmark since inception.

Overweight positions in NEPI and Vodacom were the main positive contributors to return for the quarter. Overweight positions in Famous Brands and ArcelorMittal were the main detractors.

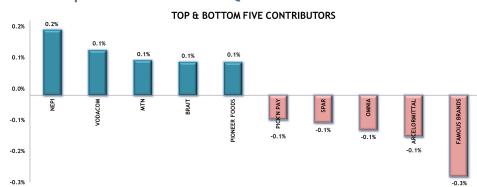
The strongest sector for second quarter of 2017, as was for the first quarter, was the Consumer Services Sector with Naspers leading the charge as it made new highs in May. The General Retailers Sector was the weakest due to depressed levels of consumer confidence and an increasing competitive landscape.

Globally, the two areas of focus dealt with Europe and the US. In Europe, it was a battle between Euro-centric and the Euro-sceptic. It seems as if the Euro-centrics have won as Macron's party easily won the French Parliament elections and the UK election resulted in the Conservatives losing their Parliament majority. Equity markets reacted positively to this as the Eurozone stability has increased. For the UK, there is now a lot of uncertainty over the Brexit policies and how it will be structured. On the other side of the Atlantic, the headlines are dominated by Trump. There is now greater concern that Trump will be unable to pass through new pro-growth fiscal policies in the short-term, negatively affecting the expectations of future US growth. Details are still short on business-friendly policies such as a decrease in taxes and loosening of regulations, as well as expected increased infrastructure spending. Currently, the focus is on the draft US Senate's health plan, so far unable to pass through parliament. parliament.

Locally, a rather difficult quarter as political and economic volatility increase. Economically, the S&P and Fitch downgraded SA's government debt to junk. Moody's also announced SA's downgrade to the lowest investment grade with the outlook remaining negative. This was due to poor growth prospects and increasing political turmoil. SA has now officially entered a recession for the first time since 2009. Politically, there has been a cabinet reshuffle and the new finance minister, Malusi Gigaba, is trying his best to reassure media that there would not be a change in the Treasury policies. The general headlines are focussed on the way forward with respect to Jacob Zuma. There was a NEC meeting held to once again discuss whether Jacob Zuma should be removed from leadership. The political battle is far from over but it appears that President Zuma is now under some pressure both from the powers that be and the citizens of South Africa. In general, lack of growth and political turmoil have negative implications on inflation, the Rand, and higher funding costs.

The cautious and prudent view would be that high volatility will remain, with more risks to the downside for equities and bonds. Gold and quality gold companies in a well-diversified portfolio may provide "insurance" in a more unpredictable environment.

NAY: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Alpha: Denoted the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month

Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive Dividend Yield: The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The divi-
